**Father Paul Hoelsing** is a rural native of the Omaha Archdiocese. He grew up in St. Boniface parish of Menominee, NE. After graduating from the University of Saint Thomas (St. Paul, MN) in 1998, he continued formation for the priesthood at the North American College and completed his Licentiate in Dogmatic Theology at the Gregorian University in Rome. Ordained in 2002, Fr. Hoelsing served three years as the Assistant Pastor of St. Bernard Parish in Omaha, Nebraska with teaching and chaplaincy duties at Roncalli Catholic High School. He then served two years as the Associate Pastor at St. Patrick Parish in O'Neill, Nebraska with teaching duties at St. Mary High School. He was appointed Director of Vocations in June of 2008 and elected President of the National Conference of Diocesan Vocation Directors in 2013. Since August 2015 he has been released by Archbishop Lucas to be the Dean of Seminarians and Director of Human Formation for Kenrick Seminary. He also serves as a faculty member of the Institute for Priestly Formation in Omaha, Nebraska.

**Father Brian Harrison, O.S.** is an Australian-born Roman Catholic priest and theologian. Harrison is a prolific writer on religious issues and an emeritus professor of theology at the Pontifical Catholic University of Puerto Rico (1989–2007). He is also an associate editor of *Living Tradition*, a publication of the Roman Theological Forum hosted by the Oblates of Wisdom in St Louis, Missouri, United States, where he currently lives at the order's study center. Harrison was baptized in the Methodist Church and brought up in the Presbyterian Church. He spent a few years with a Lutheran mission in New Guinea, where he became a Roman Catholic in 1972.
